# 30 hours Free Pre-School Education 

A guide for Parents Avanti Fields School<br>M arch 2024

All 3 and 4 year olds in England are entitled to 15 hours a weeks, or 570 hours a year or free early education. This is the universal Pre-School entitlement.
This entitle may increase to 30 hours a week if the child's parents are working and meet the following eligibility criteria-

You may be able to get 30 hours free childcare if:
you live in England
your child is 3 to 4 years old
There are:
different schemes in Scotland
different schemes in Wales
different schemes in Northern Ireland
The childcare:
must be with an approved childcare provider
stops when your child starts in reception class (or reaches compulsory school age, if later)

You may have to pay for extra costs like meals, nappies or trips.
If you've already registered, you can sign in to your childcare account.
You can apply online for a childcare account to get a code for 30 hours to give to your provider.

[^0]You may be able to get free childcare for 52 weeks if you use fewer than 30 hours per week. Check with your childcare provider to find out if this is

Your eligibility depends on:
if you are working
your income (and your partner's income, if you have one)
your child's age and circumstances
your immigration status
You can get 30 hours free childcare at the same time as claiming Universal Credit, tax credits, childcare vouchers or Tax-Free Childcare.

You can usually get 30 hours free childcare if you (and your partner, if you have one) are:
in work
on sick leave or annual leave
on shared parental, maternity, paternity or adoption leave
If you're on adoption leave for a child aged 3 to 4 years old, you must return to work within 31 days of the date you first apply for 30 hours free childcare for that child.

You may still be eligible if your partner is working, and you get Incapacity Benefit, Severe Disablement Allowance, Carer's Allowance or contributionbased Employment and Support Allowance.

You can apply if you're starting or re-starting work within the next 31 days.

You'll need to expect to earn a certain amount over the next 3 months. This is at least the National M inimum Wage or Living Wage for 16 hours a week on average.

If you have a partner, they'll need to expect to earn at least this much too.
If you're self-employed and do not expect to make enough profit in the next 3 months, you can use an average of how much you expect to make over the current tax year.

This earnings limit does not apply if you're self-employed and started your business less than 12 months ago.

If you or your partner have an expected 'adjusted net income' over $£ 100,000$ in the current tax year you will not be eligible. This includes any bonuses you expect to get.

Your adjusted net income is your total taxable income before any personal allowances and minus things like Gift Aid.

You will not be eligible if your child does not usually live with you.
If you foster your child, you cannot use the online application to get 30 hours free childcare. Speak to your social worker and your local authority if you want to apply.

To be eligible for 30 hours free childcare, you (or your partner if you have one)

You can reconfirm your eligibility up to 4 weeks before your reconfirmation date.

You will need to tick a box to confirm that your circumstances haven't changed. You won't receive a new code but your existing one will be extended for another 3 months. https://www.gov.uk/sign-in-childcare-account?step-by-step-nav=f517cd57-3c18-4bb9-aa8b-1b907e279bf9

You must amend and resubmit your details.

You need to phone the HM RC Customer Service helpline to reconfirm your eligibility.

In addition, all children in full- time Pre-School are asked to pay $£ 25.00$ a week to cover the costs of lunch time supervision and lunch.

[^0]:    You can get 30 hours of free childcare per week for 38 weeks of the year (during school term time).
